

Privacy Notice

Financial institutions choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

Types of Personal Information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include: 1.) Social Security number and income 2.) Account balance and payment history 3.) Credit history and credit scores.

We collect your personal information to: 1.) Open and account 2.) Deposit money 3.) Pay your bill 4.) Apply for a loan 5.) Use your credit or debit card.

When you are no longer our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.

Reasons we share information: All financial institutions need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies to: 1.) Process your transactions 2.) Maintain your account(s) 3.) Respond to court order and legal investigations 4.) Report to credit bureaus 5.) Market - to offer our products and services to you.

Our Security Measures: To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

Federal law gives you the right to: 1.) Limit only sharing for affiliates' for everyday business purposes - such as information about your creditworthiness. 2.) Limit affiliates from using your information to market to you. 3.) Limit sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you.

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.
